













Knowledge Organiser – Elements of Music


Key Vocabulary	Definition
crotchet	A musical note held for one beat.
minim	A musical note held for two beats.
semibreve	A musical note held for four beats.
beat	A repeated rhythmic unit in music.
stave	A set of five parallel lines on or between which musical notes are written to show their pitch.
clef	A mark that comes at the beginning of a stave to show how high or low the notes need to be.
scale	The arrangement of notes in ascending or descending order.
rest	An interval of silence within a piece of music.
crotchet rest	A rest lasting one beat.
minim rest	A rest lasting two beats.
semibreve rest	A rest lasting four beats.
rhythm	A regular repeated pattern of sound.
accent	The emphasis on a particular note.
pitch	The highness or lowness of a piece of music.
speed	How fast or slow a piece of music is.
volume	How loud or quiet a piece of music is.

semibreve	whole note			4 beats
minim	half note			2 beats
crotchet	quarter note			1 beat
quaver	eighth note	 or 		$\frac{1}{2}$ beat
semi quaver	sixteenth note	 or 		$\frac{1}{4}$ beat

time signature: $\frac{4}{4}$

treble clef = higher pitch bass clef = lower pitch

$\frac{4}{4}$ top: how many notes in each bar
bottom: units of time you are counting in
