

East Anglia, Yorkshire and the Midlands - Geography Y5



Yorkshire and Humberside

- Yorkshire is a large area in the north of England.
- North Yorkshire is the largest county in the UK.
- The Ribblehead Viaduct and the Humber Bridge are two ways in which people have changed the landscape in Yorkshire and Humberside.



Arable farming - where crops are planted, tended too and then harvested.

Pastoral farming - where animals are raised and used for food or other produce such as wool.

East Anglia

- Includes Norfolk, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire
- The Fens is a region of East Anglia that is often at or below sea level and is home to lots of wildlife.
- Known as 'Britain's bread basket'



The Midlands

- The Midlands means 'land in the middle'
- The biggest city in the Midlands is Birmingham.
- In the past, the Midlands had coal and iron mines.
