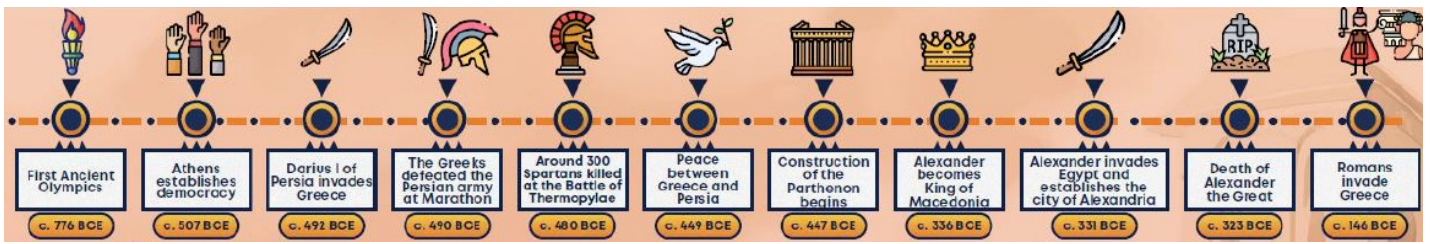


Ancient Greece - History Y3
