
Australia - Geography Y5





Aboriginal People: People living in Australia from the earliest times, before the arrival of settlers or colonists.

Colony: A country, or an area, under the control of another country and often occupied by settlers from that country.

Mining: Where a raw resource is extracted from the earth, e.g., coal

The Commonwealth: A group of countries that used to be part of the British Empire, but now voluntary work together on issues such as human rights.

Biome: a community of plants and animals that have shared characteristics due to the environment they live in.
