Parking Safely on the School Run

Norfolk County Council Road Safety Team has been working alongside Norfolk Road Safety Partners to support schools. They have developed an initiative to support us in creating a safer school environment during the school run, as well as promoting active travel. The project has been developed with full support from Norfolk Constabulary and Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service.

Over the next few weeks, Our Pupil Leadership Team will work with all children to find ways of improving the school run. This will involve creating posters for safer parking and a video to encourage walking, cycling, scooting to school. We need your support:

Please don't:

- Block the road emergency vehicles and other traffic may need access
- Park on yellow lines, zig-zags or block the school entrance
- Park on the pavement, across dropped kerbs or residents' driveways
- Park where you will cause inconvenience to other road users
- Leave your vehicle with the engine still running
- Stop in the middle of the road to drop your child off, even for a few seconds

Learning Highlights of the Week

Reception: Enchanted Forest Class

Another busy week in Enchanted Forest class. Learnt 2 new sounds in phonics (we now know 9 sounds in total) looked at Miro's artwork in art and recreated our own, counting and recognising the number 3, enjoyed circle games in PE and had a fantastic time learning the song and actions for Dingle Dangle Scarecrow for the Harvest Festival Assembly

Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

Year 1 have been exploring partitioning numbers within 10 using part-whole models. We know a whole number can be split into parts, and that parts can be combined to make a whole number!

Year 2: Neverland Class

In History, we've discovered that the Romans were hugely successful invaders who conquered and ruled a huge area of Europe and North Africa. We've been fascinated to learn that General Julius Caesar invaded in 55 and 54 BCE but the invasion was unsuccessful. Almost 100 years later, in 43 CE, the Romans invaded successfully. The invasion was led by Emperor Claudius.

Year 3: Narnia Class

Year 3 have been busy learning about fossils and how they are made. We practised sequencing the steps and creating diagrams to help us remember the different stages. In geography, we were superstars at locating places and landmarks on maps using grid references!

Year 4: Wonderland Class

We've enjoyed learning about the Romans, how Rome started and why Julius Caesar is famous. We thought he was rather arrogant to want his face on a coin and to name a month after himself. We have also been demonstrating our resilience in maths to round numbers to the nearest 10 and 100.

Year 5: Shire Class

Year 5 have had a positive week, where we spent some time learning about leadership and the different qualities a leader has. The class shared some amazing responses about what qualities they believed a leader had and when they may have shown these qualities either at home or in school.

Year 6: Hogwarts Class

Year 6 have been thoroughly enjoying reading, comparing, performing and writing scenes from Romeo and Juliet.


