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Subject Spotlight

Mathematics

At Upwell we are a *Teaching for Mastery in Maths* school, we use a combination of the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM) and White Rose Maths materials, alongside the 2014 Primary National Curriculum and 2020 DfE ready to progress criteria, to carefully sequence our curriculum.

This year we have planned a number of exciting Mathematics themed days and events including Our Maths Subject Showcase, an opportunity for parents to come into school to observe Maths in action across all year groups, our Professionals Day – this was extremely popular with the children last year, where they have the opportunity to be bakers, scientists, Olympians etc and explore the maths involved in a variety of carers and of course National Maths Day. 
Knowing times tables facts is crucially important to your child's progression in their mathematics education.

Without a deep understanding of multiplication and division facts, children frequently get 'lost' when it comes to do anything with fractions and any multiplication or division with larger numbers.


All children will complete the Multiplication Check at year 4. Information for parents can be found <u>here</u> and on the <u>Academy Website</u>




Whenever you have the opportunity, try to include maths talk in their lives. This is easily done when they are playing with physical objects as you can reinforce their counting skills. For example, how many pennies are you holding? Or what shape is that object? When counting, reinforce the last number they counted as this can help their mathematical development further, for example "one, two three…three cars. Involve your children frequently in solving real life problems. For instance, in Key Stage 2 children could help decide which car insurance company is providing the best deal or could compare a "buy one get one free" deal with a "buy 3 for 2" deal in the supermarket.

Learning Highlights of the Week

Reception: Enchanted Forest Class

We had a visit from 'Graphite Man' who took all of our pencils without permission but luckily, he just wanted to be as clever as us and he gave them back. This has inspired us to read and learn about 'Beat the Baddy' stories, so we started with Supertato.

Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

In Year 1 Art, we are learning about colour. This week we have explored making tints by adding white and making shades by adding black. We then created a painting of a splash like David Hockney and made tints and shades of blue to use in our paintings.

Year 2: Neverland Class

We have had fun innovating Jack and the Beanstalk and creating new ideas within the story. We have shown great work when adding and subtracting 1s, setting out our work neatly and self-marking. During National Poetry Day we shared and discussed a poem called 'Random Acts of Kindness'.

Year 3: Narnia Class

Year 3 have written their own narratives from the perspective of Om, the Stone Age girl, who fell down, down, down... and woke up in the modern world! It was exciting to write about her visit to Upwell Academy and describe all other differences to the life she would have experienced in the Stone Age! We have all worked extremely hard on each of the different stages of the writing process: planning, writing a draft, editing and improving!

We have really enjoyed finding out about life in the Roman Army. This has been for our English, and we have been making notes to help us when we write our information text. We have also mastered rounding numbers to the nearest 100 and 1000.

Year 5: Shire Class




