

Phonics Workshop

This week Mrs Fisher, our EYFS and English Lead held two Phonics Workshops for our Reception Class parents.

Read Write Inc. is our chosen phonics scheme, it teaches children the sounds in English, the letters that represent them, and how to form the letters when writing. Read Write Inc. Phonics includes reading books written using only the letters children have learnt at each level (and a small number of separately taught tricky words). All of our teaching and support staff are fully trained, please speak to them if you would like further information about supporting your child at home.

Learning Highlights of the Week

Reception: Enchanted Forest Class

We have been creating and learning a story map for Supertato this week. On Wednesday two local police officers came in to talk to us about how they help people, we even got to look in their car and hear the sirens.

Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

This week in English we have been exploring description. We now know that adjectives are describing words and have been using them to describe different things. We have even been thinking of the most effective adjectives we could use. Instead of 'nice', we might use 'incredible'.

Year 2: Neverland Class

This week we have published our alternative endings to Jack and the Beanstalk. We created some fantastic new magical items for Jack to take from the giant's castle. We have also enjoyed listening and responding to our new tradition tale, Little Red Riding Hood. We have sequenced the events and compared different versions.

Year 3: Narnia Class

We have started our English work linked to the text 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth'. We have been focusing on imperative (bossy) verbs and prepositions. We also followed a set of instructions in order to make our own mini woolly mammoths. Thank you so much for the milk bottles! This week, we also created our own polytile prints in art!

Year 4: Wonderland Class




