**Remembrance Day at Upwell Academy** is a time to teach our children about the reasons and customs connected with the commemoration of Remembrance Day. All our staff believe it is important that the children who attend our academy understand that the modern world has been shaped by many events, and one of these is conflict. Conflict, unfortunately, still occurs and we want our children to understand that adults and children in the past have made enormous sacrifices to allow us to have the society where we can make our own choices in the direction of our lives. As a result, we dedicate curriculum time to give the children a greater understanding of the act of remembrance and in so doing assign its importance to our community. The children in Reception to Year 6 have been busy creating beautiful artwork as part of our Remembrance Week. We are incredibly proud of the beautiful work they have created.



Our aim this week is to channel children's curiosity to allow them to understand that our present freedoms and indeed democracy are as a result of conflicts in the past and the need to defend these against others who would prefer a different type of society which is not as culturally varied or allows individuals the opportunities to make their own decisions.



We paid tribute to the country's war heroes in a special service for Remembrance, which our Year 5 pupils prepared special reading for. The service also welcomed guest speaker, Warrant Officer Morby-Jones who shared his involvement in the armed forces and what Remembrance means to him.

The Pupil Leadership Team, Pupils from reception class to Year 6, and their parents, joined by our Academy Committee Chairperson, Val Cook and AC member Raine Thorrold for a reflective walk to Upwell's War Memorial in a fitting remembrance tribute, where they laid the Academy wreath before observing a two-minute silence in memory of those who lost their lives.

### What is the Junior Duke Award?

Each of the levels contain ten challenges. In order to complete a level, children will need to complete seven of these challenges successfully. Challenges include mastering skills such as first aid, ICT, art, drama, music, sport, cookery, amongst a variety of other experiences. Children will be required to complete some of the challenges outside of school too with help from friends and family, although support will be given in school where needed. # Learning Highlights of the Week

### **Reception: Enchanted Forest Class**

This week started by having a fire engine appliance and some fire crew visit us. We talked about keeping safe and dialling 999 in an emergency and then we were able to look at the appliance and even got to squirt the hose. In English we have also learnt 'h - down the horse's head, to the hooves and over his back', 'sh - ssh said the horse to the hissing snake' and 'r - down the robot's back and over his arm.'

# Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

In Science we are learning about animals and their needs. This week we explored the difference between amphibians and mammals. We know amphibians lay eggs and live on land and in water. We know that mammals give birth to live babies and have hair or fur. We even found out that we are mammals!

# Year 2: Neverland Class

This week, we have been drafting our writing based upon Little Red Riding Hood. We are changing the story, so it is from the wolf's point of view. We have had some brilliant openings describing the wolf and his den. We have also commemorated Remembrance by listening to a story – Where the Poppies Grow, making our own poppy for the school display and taking part in the Remembrance assembly and 2-minute silence.

# Year 3: Narnia Class

This week, we have been planning and writing our own versions of 'The Egyptian Cinderella.' We have been role playing to trial our ideas, created visual plans and worked together to generate some great vocabulary. In art, we made our own clay sculptures of The Sphinx! With Remembrance Day coming up, we have read the story, 'The Christmas Truce – The Place Where Peace Was Found' and created some lovely collage poppies for our school display.

# Year 4: Wonderland Class



# Year 5: Shire Class



### Year 6: Hogwarts Class




