




## Everyone's a Hero




## **Upwell Eco Committee Poster Design**




December 8<sup>th</sup>: Flu immunisation for pupils in school years Reception - Year 6

## **Learning Highlights of the Week**

#### **Reception: Enchanted Forest Class**

In year R this week we had a special arrival, three unusual looking eggs which were found in a nest made of feathers, twigs, acorns and leaves. We made predictions about where the eggs may have come from. The eggs 'hatched', and three little owlets appeared with the book 'Owl Babies' which we are very much enjoying working on. We have been drawing pictures of the characters and the setting. We also really enjoyed Hero dress up day on Monday and learning and thinking about kindness and keeping safe.

#### **Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class**

This week in Science we have been learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We became scientists and dissected animal droppings (playdough) to discover what that animal's diet was. If we found bones, we knew it was a carnivore, if we found plants, we knew it was a herbivore and if we found both, an omnivore. We were then able to look at different animal's diets and group them into the correct category.

#### **Year 2: Neverland Class**

We have been very busy in Neverland Class, finishing and publishing our recounts of Little Red Riding Hood from the wolf's point of view. We have also been working really hard to secure out understanding of counting, comparing and calculating with money.

#### Year 3: Narnia Class

We have been reading about famous people such as Marcus Rashford and Steve Irwin and have used these texts to help us to identify the features of a biography in preparation for next week where we will be researching famous authors to write our own biographies. In Art we completed the first stage of making our Egyptian collar when learning about the 'Bust of Nefertiti'.

#### **Year 4: Wonderland Class**

We have been writing some amazing sentences in English this week. We have been using fronted adverbials and ambitious vocabulary. One of the best things has been working in pairs and sharing ideas with each other. We have also enjoyed continuing our art which links to our class name.

#### **Year 5: Shire Class**

This week we have focused our PSHE work around kindness and thinking about how we treat people around us. In English, we have also begun to explore poetry, recognising different types of poetry and their features. In Maths we are converting fractions before calculating the total of two or more. A great week Shire Class.

#### **Year 6: Hogwarts Class**

We have had some really sensible, positive and thoughtful conversations this week around anti-bullying week and respectful relationships. We have thought a lot about how we can keep ourselves and others safe. We have also talked about trusted adults and how they can help. We explored the difference between banter and bullying and discussed our collective responsibility to challenge or report incidents we have witnessed.
