



Learning Highlights of the Week

Reception: Enchanted Forest Class

We have spent some time this week practising for our very first school nativity and I think we were amazing. In class we have been using the text 'How to catch a star'. We have thought about how we would try to catch our own star and we also thought about the characters and the setting. In art we have tried to replicate Van Gogh's 'A Starry Night' using oil pastels and chalks.

Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

We have had a very exciting week. Firstly, we thoroughly enjoyed sharing our Nativity with you. I'm sure you'll agree that we did a fantastic job! In class, Sprinkles the elf has come to join us. She is very cheeky, and we have decided to try and trap her so that she can stop causing mischief. We have been learning the features of instructions so that we can write our own and carry them out next week.

Year 2: Neverland Class

This week we have been working hard on our Christmas performance ready for Monday, the children have worked really hard to learn their lines and actions. We have continued our work on multiplication; learning about the relationship between the numbers, repeated addition and how arrays can represent different calculations.

Year 3: Narnia Class

This week, Year 3 have been learning about the features of playscripts. We had a go at performing sections of a play and even turned sections of a text (The Three Little Pigs) into a playscript. We have also been learning about the ways in which people show commitment to religions including Christianity, Judaism and Sikhism. We learned about baptism, Bar and Bat Mitzvahs and the 5 Ks of Sikhism. We have also been working hard to practise our songs for the Christmas Carol Concert next week!

Year 4: Wonderland Class

We have been busy learning our songs for the Christmas Concert. We are getting better all the time and we are looking forward to you coming to listen to them. In our English we have been writing some complex sentences using fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases.

Year 5: Shire Class

This week we have been working very hard. The children have worked extremely hard in their swimming lessons with nearly everyone being fully capable swimmers! The children have been looking more at poetry whilst working very hard to produce some lovely pieces of work.

Year 6: Hogwarts Class

We started our week off with the launch of this term's 'Big Write'. We then wrote a persuasive letters to 'The Granter of Wishes' to ask for a selfless wish. We had to think of reasons to support our arguments and think of emotive vocabulary to that would influence the reader. We had some really thoughtful letters with a variety of wishes such as giving the homeless warmth, food and shelter; stopping wars from ever happening so that the money saved from defence and aid could be spent on worthy causes; finding cures for illnesses and diseases; and wishes for families or individuals who might have experienced challenges.






