
Junior Librarian


Staff Spotlight: Trust SEND Consultant – Mrs Karen Walmsley

Learning Highlights of the Week

Reception: Enchanted Forest Class

We have had a wonderful first full week back, we have started our topic on Australia, we have looked at where Australia is and where we are in the world, we have learnt about some of the wonderful landmarks down under and we have created some excellent Aboriginal style art.

Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

Our new science topic is 'The Seasons and the Weather'. This week we have explored the four seasons and what the weather might look like in each season. This has linked to English where we are exploring a poem about the seasons. This week we have focussed on words with the suffix —ing as well as descriptive language.

Year 2: Neverland Class

Mrs Pawley has thoroughly enjoyed her first full week with Year 2 and feels very welcomed by the children. We have had a great week exploring, reading and writing poetry in English. In Maths we've enjoyed identifying the properties of 2D shapes. We are thankful for the visit from Norfolk Police and It was wonderful to share our mathematics knowledge with parents today.

Year 3: Narnia Class

In Year 4 we have been enjoying exploring Ancient Greece. We have begun by reading Greek Myths in English and experimenting with Greek writing and creating our own Greek Art. On Wednesday we were able to 'show off' our excellent knowledge to our special visitors from the Trust and it has been a great first full week where I feel I have really begun to get to know the children. It was lovely to meet some parents during today's maths showcase too. Well done Year 3!

Year 4: Wonderland Class


In Year 4 we have been learning about how Henry II introduced Common Law. Before this the law was made up by the rich lords and could be different in different places. Henry introduced the idea of a jury, which we still use today in our courts. The jury listens carefully to all the evidence and then decide if you are guilty or innocent.

Year 5: Shire Class

In Year 5 we have started looking at the French Revolution and King Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette. The children have done amazingly at remembering some key dates and facts surrounding The Battle of Trafalgar and The French Revolution. We have also started looking at our multiplication using the column method where some of the children have excelled in their enthusiasm and passion for maths.

Year 6: Hogwarts Class

We began our history topic about World War II this week by looking at The Treaty of Versailles and how German people felt after the signing of the Treaty at the end of World War I. In our English we have been reading a story about a man who was a hero in World War II. The children have explored the themes within this story with a view to writing their own version of the story next week. We have also begun our new class novel — The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas.
