At Upwell Academy, we believe that a high-quality education in Mathematics not only provides vital tools for understanding the world around us, but also helps develop broader problem-solving skills. It also stimulates a curiosity that allows children to thrive in all areas of their learning.

Today we celebrated NSPCC Number Day. It is a nationally recognised event, with children across the country getting involved. Thank you for your donations, we raised just under $£ 40.00$, which will help the NSPCC run its Speak out Stay safe programme to help children understand what abuse is and what to do if they're scared or worried.

Staff dressed up for a fun-filled assembly which Val cook, our Chair of the Academy Committee joined us for.


Year 4, were ZOO KEEPERS, exploring area and perimeter and whether their chosen animals had sufficient space to survive.


Our Reception class were CONSERVATIONISTS for the day, weighing animals and counting animals while recording using tallies and charts.


Year 1 became CHEFS, exploring repeating fractions, patterns and quantities while making veggie sticks and dips and then pizza making exploring shape.

Learning Highlights of the Week
Reception: Enchanted Forest Class
What an eventful week, first we had our story telling week assembly and then we had a story telling carousel where the children heard a story from 7 different teachers, then finally today we had Number Day where the teachers were dress up as different occupations. How exciting! We also built boats using junk modelling and we learnt more about Ayres rock or Uluru as it is also known.

## Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

We have had a very exciting week in Year 1. On Wednesday, we thoroughly enjoyed visiting each class for a story to celebrate story telling week. On Friday, we transformed into chefs for numbers day. We identified how maths is incorporated into cooking and we focussed on measuring. We measured teaspoons and tablespoons when making a bean and tzatziki dip and looked at wholes, halves and quarters when chopping vegetable sticks!

## Year 2: Neverland Class

We have been thoroughly enjoying story telling week this week, in particular the story telling carousel on Wednesday, where we visited all classrooms across the academy and listened to stories told by each class teacher. Maths Day was the highlight, Mr Howe supported us all to be Olympians for the morning and we competed in a range of different Olympic sports. In the afternoon we worked on improving our measuring skills, measuring different parts of our bodies and comparing the lengths.

## Year 3: Narnia Class

We have had great week in Year 3. We really enjoyed the reading carousel - it was great to hear so many different stories. On Tuesday, we worked conducted our own internet research to lean about nutrition and how to eat a balanced diet. The children worked hard at this activity and the resulting pieces of work were very impressive. In history, we studied The Persian Wars, and created our own posters asking Greeks to join in and defeat the Persian army

## Year 4: Wonderland Class

In Year 4 we have been enjoying our storytelling week. Miss Radford told us a story about King John, who wasn't a great king, and then we recorded our retelling of the Bogey Men and the Trolls Next Door. We also enjoyed visiting other classes and hearing lots of stories.

## Year 5: Shire Class

We have had a good week in Shire Class. We really enjoyed the reading carousel this week, hearing some brilliant stories around the different classes. We have also moved to look at fractions in our maths work where the children have been challenged, building their resilience.

## Year 6: Hogwarts Class

In our poetry work, in English, this week we have been writing poems in response to poetry that we have read that raises issues about animal cruelty. The children have had some brilliant discussions about the issues raised and have written some brilliant poems in response. In maths we have also been working really hard and have been focussing our efforts on algebra. Most of us have enjoyed thinking about our maths in a slightly different way!
