






World Book Day Dress Up Winners

Parents Consultations Monday 18th and Tuesday 19th March- next week



Learning Highlights of the Week

Reception: Enchanted Forest Class

We have been learning about Jim and the beanstalk this week, we have been writing lists and letters to the giant. In art we have been looking at Henri Rosseau and we have been trying to replicate his work. In PE we completed some fitness circuits to link with our learning about growing and health.

Year 1: Crunchem Hall Class

We have had a wonderful week in Year 1. In Maths we have been learning about number bonds to 10, and how we can use them to help us with addition and subtraction problems. We have impressed Mrs Kirk with how well we can recall the number bonds! In English we are continuing to look at The Gingerbread Man, ready to write a new ending next week. This week we have been learning about inverted commas for speech, we used macaroni to represent inverted commas, to change speech bubbles into written text.

Year 2: Neverland Class

Year 2 have had Assessment Week this week and all been focused on securing our independent skills in Reading, Grammar, Spelling and Mathematics. Mrs Pawley and Ms Roberts were exceptionally proud of their determination and focus! Well done Year 2. In Art – we've completed pencil sketches of self-portraits, making sure all features are in the correct space. We've developed skin tones through colour mixing. In Geography, we've looked at adding labels and features onto a large A3 map of the British Isles, which we all really enjoyed too. Wow, what a week!

Year 3: Narnia Class

Year 3 have done some amazing work with fractions this week – they absolutely flew through the unit! In science, the children made some excellent magnet mazes to show their understanding of magnetic fields which was great fun. We have also been studying the Ancient Olympic Games in our history lessons and the class did some excellent research on the iPads.

Year 4: Wonderland Class

In Year 4 we have been writing an account as Richard III. We still can't agree on what happened to the Princes in the Tower but we all agree that Richard was very good at getting people to do what he wanted. Next week we will be thinking about why Shakespeare portrayed him in the way.

Year 5: Shire Class

In Year 5 we have been getting a deep understanding of poetry and our poem, The Highwayman has been our main focus. The children have also been looking very closely at decimals where they have been looking closely at rounding, ordering and comparing different numbers. The children have had a wonderful week and created some beautiful pieces of work. Well done Year 5!

Year 6: Hogwarts Class


